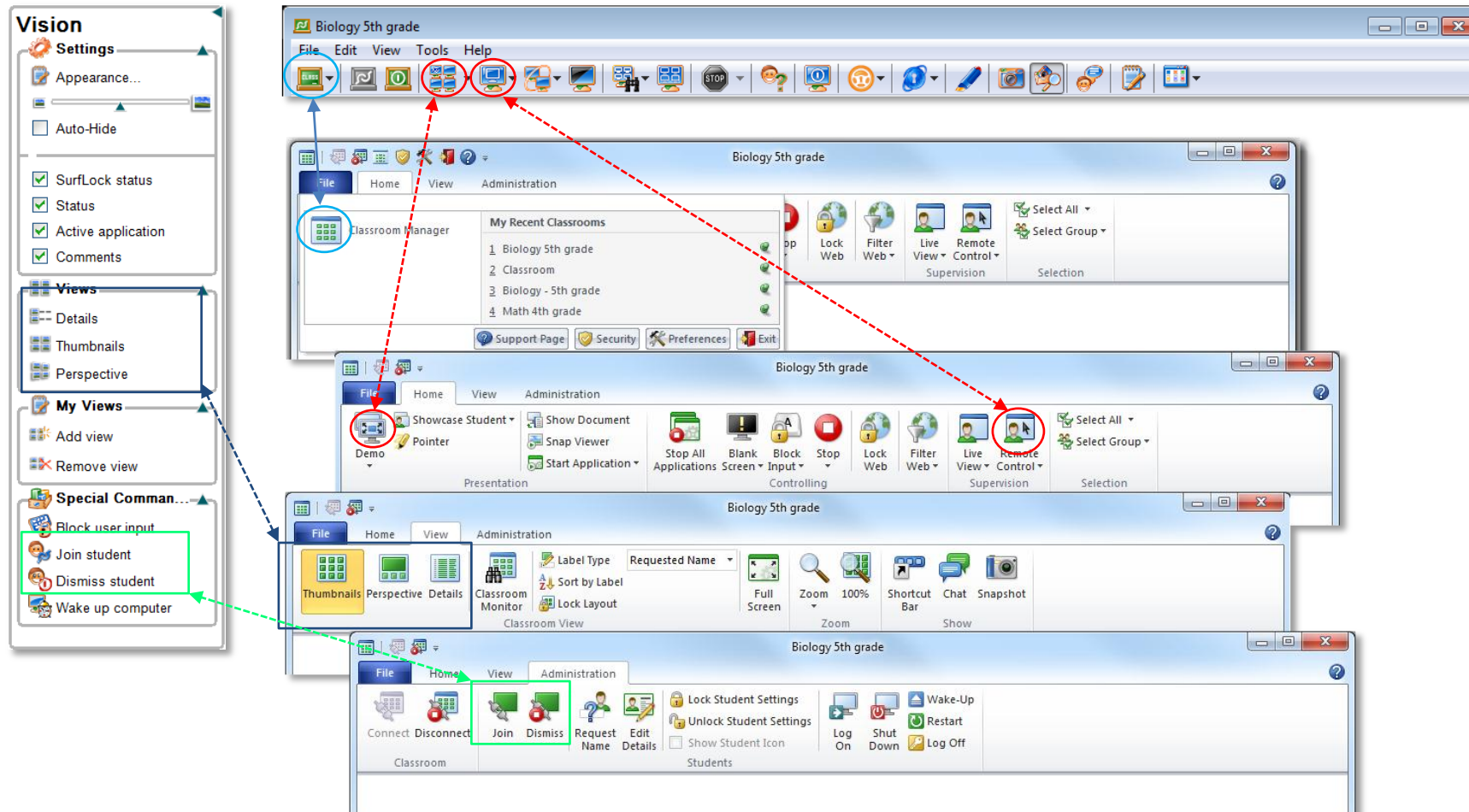















Vision6 Upgrader's guide to Vision














Are you an experienced Vision6 user wondering where to find your favorite Vision6 commands in the new Vision interface? Then this document is for you! Using little text and lots of pictures the goal of this document is to show you the location of the familiar Vision6 commands in Vision.


















COMMAND MAP




 My Classroom	File tab	File	(no ScreenTips on tabs)
 Connect Classroom	 Connect	Administration	Connect with Classroom Computers Connect with all computers in the classroom and start teaching. Computer screens will be displayed as Thumbnails
 Disconnect Classroom	 Disconnect	Administration	Disconnect from Classroom Computers Disconnect from all computers in the classroom.
 Demo	 Demo	Home	Demonstrate on the Full Screen Show your desktop on the full screen of all computers in the classroom. Automatically disables the mouse and keyboard for computers in the classroom during the demonstration.
 Remote Control	 Remote Control	Home	Start Remote Control Take control of the selected computer and use keyboard and mouse as if you were sitting in front of the remote computer.
 Virtual Teacher	 Showcase Student	Home	Use a Student Computer to Demonstrate Show the desktop of the selected student computer on all computers in the classroom, including your own.
 Blank screen	 Blank Screen	Home	Lock Computers Disable mouse and keyboard and display a standard picture or a standard text on all computers in the classroom. Note: If one or more student computers are selected, only those computers are locked.








 Live Supervision	 Classroom Monitor	Home	Monitor Classroom Computers View classroom computers in a separate window with extended options for monitoring activity.
 Supervision	 Live View	Home	Start Live View Start supervising the selected computer in a separate window.
 Stop modes	 Stop	Home	Stop Function Stop all or stop the selected function, for example a demo you are running or a remote control session you have with a student computer.
 Request user name	 Request Name	Administration	Request Name Ask the student using the selected computer to type his or her name in the dialog box that opens.
 Shutdown	 Shut Down	Administration	Shut Down Shut down all computers in the classroom.
 App-Control	 Start Application	Home	Start an Application on Student Computers Select a program that you have on your computer and start it on all computers in the classroom.
App-Control > Run	Start Application > Run Application	Home	Run an Application on Student Computers Run an application or open a Web site on student computers by dragging a shortcut from the Start menu, or a Web address from a browser address bar, and then dropping it in the Open field.
App-Control > Share Document	 Show Document	Home	Open a Document on Student Computers Select a document on your own computer and open it on all computers in the classroom. Once shared, students have their own independent copy of the document to modify and save.

App-Control > Close All Applications	 Stop All Applications	Home	<p>Stop All Applications</p> <p>Stop all applications that are currently running on the classroom computers.</p> <p>Note: If one or more student computers are selected, applications are only stopped on those computers.</p>
App-Control > Manage Application List	 Manage Applications	Home	<p>Add Applications to your Favorites List</p> <p>Add applications that you frequently use to the Applications list.</p> <p>Next time you want to start an application on student computers, you can just select it from the list. This makes it easier and quicker to start the applications when you need them.</p> <p>To prevent students from closing the application you start or from working with other applications, start the application in Kiosk mode.</p>
 Surf-Lock	 Filter Web	Home	<p>Filter Web</p> <p>Apply a web access filter on all classroom computers.</p> <p>Note: If one or more student computers are selected, only those computers have restricted web access.</p>
Surf-Lock > Lock Internet	 Lock Web	Home	<p>Lock Web</p> <p>Block access to the Internet on all classroom computers.</p> <p>Note: If one or more student computers are selected, only those computers are locked.</p>
Surf-Lock > Apply All Site List	Filter Web > Apply All	Home	<p>Apply All</p> <p>Allow classroom computers to access only web sites in the combined resource lists.</p> <p>Access to all other sites is blocked.</p>
Surf-Lock > Release All Site List	Filter Web > Clear All	Home	<p>Clear All</p> <p>Remove all resource list filters from classroom computers.</p>

Surf-Lock > Site List Manager	Filter Web > Manage Lists	Home	Manage Lists Create or modify lists which filter web access.
 Pointer	 Pointer	Home	Use Drawing Tools to Highlight Areas on Your Screen Use arrows, highlighters and shapes to draw attention to areas of your screen during demonstrations. You can also zoom in and magnify any part of your screen or spotlight a particular object while the rest of the screen is dimmed.
 Snap	 Snapshot	View	Snapshot Create a screenshot of the full screen, a window or of an area of the application. If you have a Webcam connected to your computer, you can also take a photograph using the camera.
 Snap Viewer	 Snap Viewer	Home	Show Screenshots on Student Computers Start Snap Viewer on all student computers to show any screenshots you take using Snapshot . Students can right-click each screenshot thumbnail to see the screenshot in normal size or in full screen, and to copy, save or print the screenshot. Click Snap Viewer to close it again on student computers.
 Chat	 Chat	View	Chat Open Chat and start interacting with students in your classroom. You can send text messages, run poll based questionnaires and exchange files with computers in your classroom.
 Properties	 Edit Details	Administration	Edit Student Computer Information View technical information about the selected computer, including operating system version and Vision version, and add custom information about the computer.

 <p>Settings: Appearance Zoom Auto-Hide</p>	<p>File > Preferences > Appearance</p>  <p>Zoom - 100%</p> <p>(Auto-Hide is no longer relevant as it related to panels which are now obsolete)</p>	<p>File</p> <p>View</p> <p>View</p>	<p>Zoom</p> <p>Control the zoom level.</p> <p>You can also control the zoom level using the zoom control at the bottom right of the window.</p> <hr/> <p>100%</p> <p>Show thumbnails in their full size.</p>
	 <p>Details</p>  <p>Thumbnails</p>  <p>Perspective</p>	<p>View</p> <p>View</p> <p>View</p>	<p>Details</p> <p>Show detailed information about classroom computers in text format. 		Administration	<p>Lock Student Module Settings</p> <p>Disable access to general and network settings on the selected computer.</p> <p>The general settings include startup method (whether to start automatically or manually) and the network settings include choice of wired or wireless connection.</p>
		Administration	<p>Restart</p> <p>Restart all computers in the classroom.</p>
		Administration	<p>Log Off</p> <p>Close down all applications running on the classroom computers and log off the students who are currently logged on.</p> <p>Computers then display Windows' logon screen and are available for new users to log on.</p>
	Full Screen (introduced in Vision7 to maximize screen real estate)		<p>Full Screen</p> <p>Hide the ribbon to maximize the screen area used to display student computers.</p> <p>Press the Esc key to exit full-screen mode and bring back the ribbon.</p>

NEW IN VISION OR VISION PRO AS COMPARED TO VISION6

The below features are new in Vision as compared to what you are familiar with from Vision6:

Feature	Description	Edition
 Block lists	<p>A block list includes one or more web sites that students are not allowed to access. For example, a block list could include social media sites or popular web games.</p> <p>When a block list is applied, access to the sites in the list is blocked.</p> <p>A block list is defined using Manage Lists on the Filter Web menu.</p>	Pro
Improved screen sharing capabilities	<p>Demo, Showcase Student and Remote Control automatically use hardware accelerated mode by default and performance is dramatically improved as compared to previous version.</p> <p>To compare the two modes, you could use this test drive page from Microsoft: http://ie.microsoft.com/testdrive/Pe...k/Default.html</p> <p>Open the page and start a demo to one or more student computers. You will notice that the screen updates on teacher and student computers are practically simultaneous.</p> <p>To see how the demo works without the hardware accelerated mode, stop the demo and go to Preferences (File > Preferences > Demo) to disable the hardware acceleration. Now start the demo again and compare your experiences.</p>	Pro
 Log On	<p>Log on all student computers, using the same user name and password.</p> <p>Administration > Log On</p>	Pro
 Support Page	<p>Direct links to a variety of Vision resources like training videos, user forum, product documentation and feedback form. The Support page also includes chat button that enables you ask questions directly from technical support.</p> <p>File > Support Page</p>	Both
