

## How to access mapped network drives in the Netop File Manager on a Host computer with UAC enabled.

When a Netop File Transfer connection is established to a Host running on a system with UAC enabled it is not possible to access the mapped network drives on the Host in the Netop File Manager Window. This symptom is caused by the way UAC prevents access to these drives. The solution to this issue is to create a new registry key entry. The instructions are outlined below.

**Due to the risks associated with editing the Windows registry this task should only be performed by your system administrator. [Click Start, type regedit in the Start programs and files box, and then press ENTER. Locate and then right-click the subkey HKEY\\_LOCAL\\_MACHINE\SOFTWARE\Microsoft\Windows\CurrentVersion\Policies\System. Point to New Value. Type EnableLinkedConnections, and then press ENTER. Right-click EnableLinkedConnections and then click Double-click.](#)
